



Year 3 Homework - Autumn Term 2020

<p>If you are reading a non-fiction book, create a diagram (a labelled picture) of something you have learned.</p> 	<p>Write a story that includes a Pharaoh in it.</p> 	<p>Research different 2D shapes and find facts about them, such as how many sides and angles they have.</p> 	<p>Use some simple resources to make some Egyptian jewellery.</p> 
<p>Take a character from your book and explain what type of person you think they are.
