

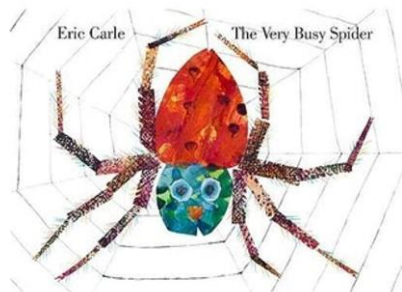
Summer 2 - Reception Home Learning Challenges

Hello everyone,

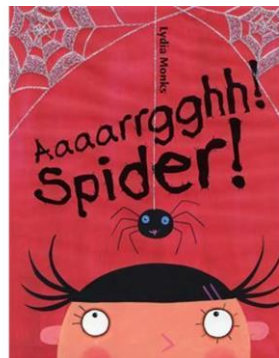
Hope you continue to be well. Thank you to those families that have got the Seesaw app and are sending us your work.

1. Watch the 'Come outside' all about spiders.

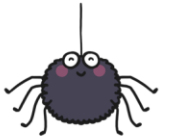

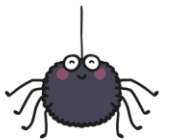
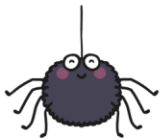


3. Go on a web hunt and identify where spiders like to make their webs. Have a go at drawing the webs that you see.



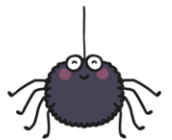
4. Sing the rhyme 'Incy Wincy Spider' with actions.
