Conjunctions (and, but, because, so, if, that, when) Adjectives (describing words) , commas in a list Apostrophes for omission e.g. didn't, couldn't, I've Suffixes (-ful -ness -less -ly, -ed, -ment) Handwriting - Capitals touching the top line. All letter the correct size, tall proud letters (ascenders) touching the top line and lazy letters (descenders) under the line. 

Use recyclable materials to make your very own minibeasts.



Magic Potions

You will need:
