


<p>Writing</p> <p>Whenever you complete some writing you should include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Capital letters (beginning of a sentence and for a name)• Full stops• ! ?• Conjunctions (and, but, because, so, if, that, when)• Adjectives (describing words)• , commas in a list• Apostrophes for omission e.g. didn't, couldn't, I've• Suffixes (-ful -ness -less -ly, -ed, -ment)• Handwriting - Capitals touching the top line. All letter the correct size, tall proud letters (ascenders) touching the top line and lazy letters (descenders) under the line. Letter must be formed correctly, starting at the right place.	<p>They take Tim's age and double it. Then they add 5. The answer is 35. 
- **Matching Pairs**

Write each of your spelling words in the air using a magic finger!


- **Dough Letters**
