

Adding **-ed** to the end of a word often puts it in the past tense.

When adding -ed to a root word ending in y (with a consonant before it), first change the y to an i , then add -ed . Example words: copied, cried, replied	When adding -ed to a root word ending in e (with a consonant before it), drop the e , then add -ed . Example words: liked, waved, baked	When adding -ed to words with one syllable, the last consonant letter of the root word is doubled . Example words: patted, hummed, dropped

played, helped, walked






