*Please be aware that as we are currently still in times of a worldwide pandemic it is very difficult to give confirmed dates of events too far in the future. Therefore, please be aware that these dates and times are provisional and are subject to change.*



If your child is entitled to free school meals you are now entitled to receive supermarket vouchers once again instead of the food hamper packs that we have been distributing over the past few weeks.

Vouchers will be mailed out weekly in arrears and will come from Schoolvouchers.com. This is likely to be on a Monday – with the first vouchers for wb 25.01.21 being sent out starting on Monday 1<sup>st</sup> February.

The first time the voucher is issued you will receive a link by email and by text message where you will need to register and be asked to select which supermarket you would like your vouchers for. After this vouchers should be sent out each week based on this selection. You can change your supermarket at any time before the next voucher is sent out. The supermarkets you can choose from are:-

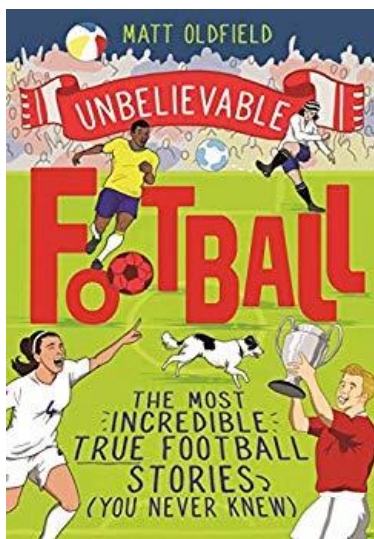
# Focus on Reading
