School Fluoride Varnish Programme

As you may be aware we are partnered with Select Dental Care and are running the Fluoride Varnish Programme for children in Nursery, Reception, Y1, Y2, Y3 and Y4. The next stage of the Fluoride Varnish Programme will take place on Thursday 18th May. Forms have already been issued. Please ensure these forms are returned to school by Thursday 11th May.

*** Fidget Spinners ***

Please be reminded that fidget spinners are toys and should not be brought into school. Any pupil found bringing a fidget spinner to school will have it confiscated. It will be kept in the office for their parent/carer to collect.

IMPORTANT SAFEGUARDING INFORMATION

Please remember that if your child is ill and unable to attend school that you should telephone the school in order to let us know. This is so that we know that your children are safe and in school if they should be.

As a result of their child's attendance some parents and carers are asked to provide medical evidence for their child not attending school. Please be aware that even if you have medical evidence you still need to telephone school to inform us that your child will not be in school.

If you fail to telephone school we may have to call you, but would appreciate that you answer the call – again so that we are aware of where your child is and why they are not in school.

Unfortunately the number of parents and carers who are not informing us that their children are unable to attend school for whatever reason has risen in the past few weeks. A growing number of parents and carers are not answering their phones when they are contacted and not returning voicemail messages. Please be aware that all calls to parents/carers regarding pupils non-attendance in school are logged. If we are not able to contact you we may need to carry out a home visit as we need to ensure your child's wellbeing and safety. Again, this will also be logged on our school system.
