PE KIT REMINDER

From Tuesday 1st November, it is essential that your child brings a correct PE kit to school. His should be available in school from Monday to Friday each week.

A PE kit consists of:-

- Navy T-shirt
- Navy shorts
- Plimsolls or trainers

(Black or navy jogging bottoms may be worn for PE outdoors in winter months.)

Please ensure that all PE kit is named.

School shoes can never be worn for PE as they do not provide the correct support or meet health and safety requirements.

Football strips and branded sports wear are not appropriate and pupils will not be allowed to wear these for PE lessons.

If your child does not have the correct PE kit they may be required to wear a PE kit from our communal supply or be unable to participate in the PE session.
