## **Keeping Children Safe**

A special message from our e-safety leader, Mrs Davison:-

### E-Safety

As Summer is fast approaching, we would like to advise parents and carers about the need for children to stay safe online as well as in the real world.

Many children in school have Instagram, Facebook, Snapchat, Twitter or other social media accounts. We would like to remind parents that the recommended age restrictions for these social media platforms is 13 years old for good reason. Research shows that it takes children about 12 years to fully develop the cognitive structures that enable them to engage in ethical thinking. Before 12 it's difficult for a child to fully grasp the impact of their actions upon others, online or otherwise.

If parents do decide to allow children to have these accounts, there are still ways to keep safe online. Often talking about their accounts is a good way to develop an understanding of your child's online profile. However, as settings and features are constantly changing, it is always good to understand the basics of security online.
