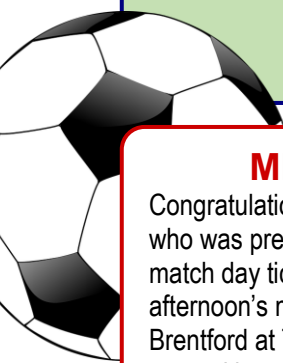

Safeguarding Update

We need to be able to ensure that all children are safe on their way to and from school. To help us do this we expect parents/carers to:-

- Let us know by telephone if their child is unwell and unable to attend school. If your child is not in school and we do not hear from you and are unable to contact you by telephone, it is likely that a home visit will be made by a member of staff or an Education Social Worker (ESW) in order to ensure your child is safe.
 - Complete and sign the appropriate form if they give permission for their child to walk home alone at the end of school (Y4-Y6 only). If we do not have a signed form in school we are unable to release your child/ren at the end of the day and we will have to contact you by telephone to collect them.
- Children from pre-school – Y3 must be collected by an adult.
