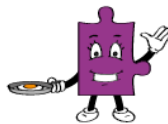

## Advance Warning - Swimming

The government expectation is that all pupils can swim at least 25m by the time they leave primary school. At Archibald Primary swimming lessons are in Y3 and Y4.

## HEALTH & SAFETY UPDATE



Please remind your children to stay safe near roads, and more importantly model good road safety to your children at all times.

The roads surrounding our school are very busy at all times, but especially at the start and end of the school day. Despite this we have recently received reports of some parents and children crossing the main roads without using the crossings and of parents and children rushing across the crossings once the green man is no longer lit. In recent weeks there have been a number of 'near misses' involving parents and children reported to school by members of the public

Please cross the roads safely at all times using crossings where these are provided. Younger children should, wherever possible hold an adults hand when walking next to busy roads.
