Triangulation Meetings

Attendance Tips

Advice on how to ensure your child has the best opportunities to make maximum progress by being in school, on time every day:-

- **Have a clear routine each morning** – aim to arrive at school in time for the doors opening at 8:45am. Pupils arriving after 8:55am will need to enter through the main entrance and register at the office.
- **Arrange medical appointments out of school time.** If this is not possible there is no need to stay away from school for the whole day. Pupil's attendance is not negatively impacted if they are in school for the start of the session before leaving to go to medical appointments.
- **Do not take holidays in term time.** This will also avoid you having to pay fixed penalty notices.
- **Only keep your child away from school if they are genuinely unwell.** Children with a cough or cold should still attend school. Children on medication can still attend school.
- **Do not keep your child off school if they have fallen out with their friends.** If your child is having friendship issues (and many do) please contact one of our school mentors so that these can be sorted out.

KEEPING IN TOUCH

Don't forget to let us know if you have changed your mobile telephone number or email address over the summer as these are the main ways we communicate with you.

Our school newsletter is emailed out each week on a Monday. You should also have received information from your child's teachers in a year group newsletter. If you do not have email, copies of all newsletters are displayed in the main school entrance and printed copies are available from the school office.

REMINDER – End of School Arrangements

Please remember that if you collect your children from school at the end of the day you are responsible for their behaviour and conduct on the school grounds. For the safety of all adults and children on our busy school site please do not allow your children to climb fences or walls, go on the climbing frame or ride bikes or scooters on the school grounds.
